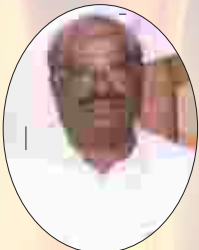

Minutes of the meeting of the Annual General body of the All India Chess Federation held at 12.30 PM (or immediately after the Central Council Meeting) on Sunday the 28th June, 2015 at the Hotel Savera, (Sandesh Hall) 146, Dr.Radhakrishnan Road, Chennai – 4 to transact the following Agenda.

Members present: Annexure 1

Mr.P.R.Venketrama Raja, President AICF chaired the meeting.

Before the Agenda was taken up for consideration, the General Body unanimously agreed to condone the lapse on the part of Nagaland Chess Association, All Assam Chess Association Ad-hoc Committee, Telangana Chess Association Ad-Hoc Committee, All Arunachal Pradesh Chess Association and Sikkim Chess Association in sending the Annual Subscription after the due date, i.e. 30th April, 2015 and permitted their continuance as an affiliated State Chess Association.

AGENDA 1. To confirm the minutes of the Annual General Body meeting held on 22.06.2014 at Chennai.

Decision

The minutes of the Annual General Body held on 22.06.2014 at Chennai were unanimously confirmed.

AGENDA 2. Matters arising out of the Minutes.

Decision

The above minutes have been registered with the Registrar of Societies and duly approved.

AGENDA 3. To consider and approve the audited statement of accounts for the year 2014-2015.

Decision

The audited Statement of Accounts for the year 2014 – 2015 was adopted unanimously. The members were informed that the Finances of the Federation is very sound and Rs.4.50/- Crores is in the form of Fixed Deposit. The same was recommended by the Central Council to the AGM for adoption was unanimously agreed.

AGENDA 4: To consider and approve the annual report for the year 2014 - 15.

Decision:

The Annual Report was presented by the Hon. Secretary and the operational part of it is given below:

"It is with great pleasure I present the Annual report of our activities for the year 2014 - 2015 to this august body after a fresh set of office bearers were elected at the AGM held in June 2014 at Chennai. We have a new President in Mr.P.R.Venketrama Raja the Vice Chairman and M.D. of Ramco group of companies who were the first to sponsor 5 times world champion GM Viswanathan Anand for nearly a decade after 1991. It was his vision that India should win a medal in the Olympiad and he infact organised a meeting of the newly elected office bearers of AICF in July 2014 to formulate ideas to achieve the dream which every chess loving Indian wanted. I am therefore fortunate to be the Hon. Secretary of the Federation when India created chess history by winning the first ever medal in a chess Olympiad held at Tromso, Norway during August 2014. I am referring to the Bronze medal winning performance of our team lead by Grandmaster K.Sasikiran and the other members of the team namely GM B.Adhiban, GM S.P.Sethuraman, GM, M.R.Lalith Babu and GM Parimarjan Negi with GM R.B.Ramesh as the coach.

To enjoy this unique achievement, the Federation got up a function to felicitate these medal winners and presented them with a purse of Rs.3 lakhs each and Rs.1.5 lakhs to the coach. GM K.Sasikiran and WGM Padmini Rout were also presented a cash awards for their medal winning performances in playing 3rd and 4th board at the Olympiad respectively.

Further, the Central Council of the All India Chess Federation decided to honour the above medal winning Olympiad team members by organising an India - China summit chess match with the prize fund of Rs.10 lakhs sponsored by the AICF. By finishing second the Indian players shared Rs.4 lakhs prize fund among themselves. The match which was held at Hyderabad was organised by the Telangana Chess Association Ad-hoc committee and special thanks to Mr.K.S.Prasad who was instrumental in hosting the match by getting the sponsors.

Year after year it is seen that the All India Chess Federation is growing in stature due to sustained work put in by all the stake holders like the State Associations, organizers of various tournaments, the coaches, the academies, the arbiters, the players supported by many State Governments and especially the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India / Sports Authority of India. Added to these, is a bunch of dedicated set of office bearers of the Federation who left no stone unturned to run the Federation as per its objectives. The office bearers have been fortunate enough to have hard working Secretarial staff and the guidance of its President Mr.P.R.Venketrama Raja.

All these things have resulted in some spectacular performances by our players who continued the good legacy that has been established, especially from 2005, and have made us proud by their spectacular performances both at the Asian and World forums. The Federation was very active and a record 249 tournaments were rated by the FIDE of which 25 were International open tournaments. All the National Championships were held as planned and the players were selected to represent India on the basis of the performances in these championships. As a result of all these, at the end of this financial year we have 36 Grand Masters, 80 International Masters, 7 Women Grand Masters, 22 Women International Masters, 46 FIDE Masters, 31 Women FIDE Masters, Candidate Masters, Woman Candidate Masters, 100 International Arbiters and 105 FIDE Arbiters. We are now ranked 8 in the Men FIDE ranking list and 5 in the women. The number of FIDE registered players has increased to 46726 from 38085 and the number of players currently rated is 17244 as on 31.03.2015. The number of players registered with AICF is 17397. This is a quantum jump over the year.





Thanks to the organisation of so many tournaments, the chess players benefitted immensely by way of prize money to the tune of Rs.4,67,43,411.00. Of these, Rs.3,60,91,411.00 were given as prize money in all the rating tournaments put together, Rs.42,02,000.00 was given as prize money in all the National Championships and Rs.64,50,000.00 was given as prize money in all the Grandmaster tournaments.

As usual the Federation organised two official FIDE championships. The World Junior Chess Championship was organised at Pune by the Maharashtra Chess Association under the aegis of Maharashtra Chess Association from 05th to 19th October, 2014. The Asian Youth U 14, 16, 18 Chess Championship was organised at Delhi by the Delhi Chess Association from 06th to 14th November, 2014. Both these tournaments were a resounding success. Due to bringing such tournaments to India, the AICF has helped hundreds of our players to participate or otherwise they have to travel abroad spending huge money to participate in such tournaments.

The Federation had not only concentrated on developing the game and the players but had also took care to arm itself with more technically qualified persons by organising a Arbiter Seminar at Delhi from 11th to 13th November 2014 and a Trainer's Seminar also at Delhi from 27th to 29th June, 2014. Apart from this India played host to the Arbiters' Refresher course conducted by the FIDE. Needless to say, these Seminars has helped us to have more technically qualified people.

I am also happy to share with you that Indian presence in FIDE has also increased manifold. FIDE officials have started respecting India and the Federation, especially after our successful conduct of the FIDE World Championship Match between Grandmaster V.Anand and Grandmaster Magnus Carlsen in 2013. The western chess world has started looking up at India. As a result many of our members have found a place in various FIDE committees. Mr.D.V.Sundar our former Secretary of the All India Chess Federation has been re-elected as the Vice President of FIDE with a record 103 votes (highest among 13 contestants) at the FIDE Congress held at Norway in August 2014. Mr.Bharat Singh was elected as the President of Commonwealth Chess and Deputy President of the Asian Chess Federation. He was also nominated as the Chairman of the Rules and Technical committee of the FIDE. Mr.R.M.Dongre has been nominated as the Councillor in the Chess in Schools committee. Mr.R.Anantharam has been nominated as the Councillor in the Arbiter's commission and member of the Qualification Commission & Systems of Pairings and Programs. Mr.V.Hariharan your Hon. Secretary is a member of the qualification commission. IM Sekhar Sahu has been nominated as a member of the FIDE Trainers' commission.

With 33 affiliated units and 12 Institutional members with thousands of subsidiary units functioning under these entities the game of chess has thus spread all over the country which helps the Federation in furthering its cause. The activities from all over India gained momentum as 249 tournaments were rated by the FIDE out of which 198 tournaments were FIDE rated tournaments. Tamil Nadu State Chess Association, Delhi Chess Association, Venus Chess Academy, All Orissa Chess Association, and Barua Chess Academy were instrumental in organised International Grandmaster tournaments thus making it possible for our players to get FIDE title norms. We should also appreciate the following State Associations for facilitating rating tournaments - Maharashtra (41), Tamilnadu (39), Karnataka (17), Kerala (17), Delhi (16), Orissa (14), Telangana (10), West Bengal (9), Gujarat (7), Goa (6), Andhra Pradesh (4), Assam (4), Jharkhand (3), Bihar (2), Punjab (2), Uttar Pradesh (2), Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir, Mizoram, Madhya Pradesh, Pondicherry each (1) making it a total of 198.

The vision of AICF to make India the strongest chess playing country in the world is set to become a reality. India is now ranked no.1 in the number of FIDE registered players, 46726 as per FIDE. We have surpassed giants like Russia 42766, France 39769, Spain 34616, Germany 29501. Thanks to the continued support of the Government we were able to provide our players with all possible foreign exposure and also give them intensive coaching under eminent and renowned chess trainers.

At the administrative level I am happy to share with you that the Hon'ble High Court of Jurisdiction at Madras by its Order dated 03.03.2015 had INTERIM ORDER MADE ABSOLUTE IN THE MATTER OF AICF Vs CHESS ASSOCIATION OF INDIA as given below.

"In the result, the interim injunction already granted by this Court on 28.12.2012 in O.A.No.1078 of 2012 is made absolute and the application is ordered accordingly. Consequently, the application in A.No.1956 of 2013 seeking to revoke the leave granted by this Court in A.No.5615 of 2012 vide its order dated 27.12.2012 is dismissed since this Court has come to the conclusion that this Court has got jurisdiction to decide the issue involved in the suit."

Earlier in December 2012, the Court had passed the following Interim Order.

"That 1.Chess association of India, Rep. By its Secretary General, Surendra K.Tewari, the 1st respondent herein, be and are hereby restrained by an order of Interim Injunction from using in its name or domain name of website/URL, the words "India" or "Indian" and from conducting chess tournaments in the name and style of "National" Championships/Tournaments".

Financially, the AICF has stabilized its funds position and we look comfortable. It is our desire to have a very healthy bank balance so that we can increase our chess development programs without any financial constraints"

The members appreciated the excellent work done by the Hon. Secretary, office bearers and all other stake holders like the affiliated State Associations, players, arbiters, coaches and organisers. Special thanks was recorded to the Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports and the Sports Authority of India for their continued support. The above report recommended by the Central Council was unanimously adopted.

AGENDA 5: To consider and approve the budget for the year 2015 - 2016.

AGENDA 7: Amendments to the Constitution, proposed by CC or by affiliated Association, to discuss and decide with or without modifications. (A new Section 24 (c) is added. 24 (a) and 24 (b) remain the same. Likewise in Section 27 under Annexures, a new annexure IV is added. Annexure I, II and III remain the same).

Section 24: Expulsion/Suspension:

(a) If an Office Bearer, affiliated unit or its Office Bearers or a player or an individual directly or indirectly connected with the Federation refuses to comply with the provisions of this Constitution, Rules and Regulations or is guilty of such conduct which in the opinion of the central Council is likely to affect the character or stability or interest of the Federation, such person or affiliated Unit or its Office Bearers shall be liable for expulsion or suspension for such periods as the Central Council may fix by a Resolution adopted by not less than two-thirds of the Members of the Council present at such Meeting. The Secretary shall cause Notice to the Organisation/Individual calling for their explanation and they shall be placed for the consideration of the Central Council. Any refusal to accept the Notice by the party shall be treated as Notice having been served.	No Change
(b) In the event of dissolution or defunct Association or Pursuant to expulsion or Suspension under 24.A or pursuant to action taken under section 9 & 16 the central council shall appoint an Ad. Hoc Committee consisting of 5 members in place of the State Association, to run the affairs of the Association, until fresh elections are held under AICF's supervision, so that the interest of Chess players are protected. c. NIL	c. Suo Moto action: Under extra-ordinary circumstances, where a disciplinary action is necessary to protect the objects of the constitution and Bye laws of AICF, the Hon. Secretary/Central Council shall Suo Moto take action [the action attracting Section 24(a)],

	against any player, official, State Association, District Association, Academy etc., to suspend from all chess activities, debar, impose penalties etc., with the reasons being put in writing. However, the matter shall be placed in the next Central Council/AGM for a final decision.

Section 27: Rules and Regulations:

Tournaments shall attend the Coaching Camp/Camps if any conducted by the Federation prior to the relevant event unless exempted by the Hon. Secretary.

- (c) Players shall desist from indulging in any act detrimental to the interests of Federation nor shall they spearhead any movement against the Federation. They shall not also pass any derogatory remarks in public or to the press about the Federation.
- (d) Players, either in their personal capacity or in the capacity as a player or the captain of a team, shall not make any public announcements without the approval of the competent authority.
- (e) Players shall desist from harming other players, their property or that of the organizers and the Federation and shall not resort to disorderly behaviour or any subversive act or any act of indiscipline during chess events and functions.
- (f) Players shall not make abusive or derogatory language against anybody during the course of a competition, nor shall they make any unjustified accusations against anybody.
- (g) Players shall cooperate with the organizers of tournaments, in all matters and strictly abide by the Rules and Regulation of Tournaments.
- (h) Players shall conduct themselves with dignity and be dressed decently at all chess events and functions.
- (i) Players who want to go out of India to participate in tournaments shall

	take prior permission from the Federation by writing to the Hon. Secretary.	
(j)	Players shall not fraudulently participate in events.	
(k)	Players should not smoke or be drunk in the tournament hall during the course of chess events and functions.	
(l)	During coaching camps, players shall strictly follow the Rules and Regulations of the Federation and the instructions of the Coach and also do their best to take advantage of the Coaching Camps.	
(m)	Players shall remit the entry fees for tournaments as specified in the regulations and shall not bargain or argue at the venue of the tournament.	
(n)	Date of Birth certificates registered within one year of the birth of the child alone will be recognized and allowed to participate in age group championships by the AICF and all affiliated members of AICF.	
(o)	Players shall present themselves for Medical Test to determine their age at any time when called upon to do so by All India Chess Federation or its affiliates. "The AICF will have the powers to arrange for Medical test to determine the age of any player at any time if there is a suspicion, particularly for those who wish to participate in age group tournaments abroad".	
(p)	Players shall not speak (or indicate anything by sign) to anybody other than the arbiters of that tournament, during the course of a game	
(q)	Players shall be present for the

opening and closing ceremonies of championships/tournaments.

- (r) Players shall not leave the venue of championships/tournaments without the permission of the Chief Arbiter.
- (s) Players shall not withdraw from tournaments without valid reasons and without the permission of the Chief Arbiter.
- (t) Fraud, cheating, embezzlement, theft, willful damage to or dishonesty in connection with Federation's property, funds or records.
- (u) Offers or attempts to offer or receiving or attempts to receive any consideration in kind, cash or otherwise to influence the results of games, tournaments, election or any chess events of the Federation.
- (v) Failure to comply with normally accepted standards and Chess etiquette.
- (w) Any other act which is against the aim and objects of the Federation and detrimental to its interests.
- (x) Players desirous of participating in any official FIDE / Asian / Commonwealth Championships should have participated in the last years respective age group / open National Championships. However, the Federation shall have the right to accept or reject any such requests.
- (y) Players shall strictly abide by the Constitution, Rules Regulations and Orders/Instructions of the Federations in force from time to

time and also abide by the instructions of the Arbiters and AICF Office Bearers.

- (z) No player shall participate in any tournament not authorised by All India Chess Federation or by its affiliate members or District Associations and units affiliated to them. The above violation shall attract disciplinary proceedings including cash penalties apart from debarring from participating in any tournaments in future.

(z)(i) Players should represent the country on directions to do so. Failing which the Federation will not recommend to the Government for any financial grants or awards. In this regard the Federation has received communication from the Government which is quoted below.

"Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports has sent a communication regarding curbing the tendency amongst sportsperson for giving preference to playing in prize money tournaments rather in tournaments where India participates for medals rather than cash awards. By this communication the Ministry had made it clear to all recognised National Sports Federations that individual players will be able to avail grants given to NSFs by the Ministry only if they undertake to play in Indian team when called upon to do so without reservations. If there are specific exigencies because of which they are unable to play, this should be verified by the concerned NSF which thereupon can make an exception at their discretion".

- (z)(ii) certificates will be issued for only those players (donor / special entry) who win medals in any official championships.

III. Organisation of National Championship / Tournaments:

Conditions for organizing chess events:

- (a) A bid for organizing a chess event shall be made in the prescribed

format along with the required fees, detailed estimate and budget.

- (b) Only National / Senior National / International Arbiters shall be appointed for National and International FIDE Tournaments as the case may be in consultation with the Federation.
- (c) An Arbiter officiating in a National Tournament as Chief Arbiter shall be eligible for an honorarium as decided by the Federation from time to time.
- (d) In cases where any grant is received by the organizers through the Federation audited statement of accounts shall be submitted to the Federation within one week of the conclusion of the conclusion of the event falling which a fine of two percent of the total grant shall become payable by the organizers.
- (e) The President or the Hon. Secretary shall have the right to demand advance deposit of the prize fund or bank guarantee for a like amount before granting the tournaments/chess events.
- (f) Invitation containing all essential details such as venue, date, time, schedule, eligibility, seeding criteria, entry fee, prize money, system of play, other rules and regulations, accommodation, and other information necessarily required by the participating units and players shall be issued at least sixty days before the commencement of the tournament.
- (g) Events shall be conducted in accordance with FIDE and AICF rules.
- (i) In all the National Championships the tie break

Annexure IV: Code of Conduct for All Arbiters

1. Arbiters shall register with the All India Chess Federation through their respective State Associations by paying the Annual Registration Fee as prescribed by AICF financial regulation from time to time to be considered for appointment as arbiter in any tournament.
2. Arbiters shall be unbiased in tournaments and they shall exhibit no nepotism or favouritism in delivering decisions.
3. Arbiters have to be thorough





with Laws of Chess, Rating, Pairing and Title Regulations and other related topics.

4. Arbiters have to abide by the rules and regulations of All India Chess Federation and FIDE.
5. Arbiters shall obtain prior permission from All India Chess Federation (through their state associations) to serve tournaments in other countries.
6. An arbiter who wants to serve in tournaments held in states other than his own, has to get prior permission from his state association (through his district association) to do so.
7. Only qualified title holders shall serve as arbiters in tournaments. For state championships and state level tournaments, at least Senior National Arbiter title holders shall be appointed as Chief Arbiter. At State level tournament, the other arbiters should be atleast state level Arbiters. For rating tournaments, the chief arbiter shall be at least a FIDE arbiter.
8. Arbiters shall be in proper attire in tournaments. If uniform T shirt/waist coat/blazer is provided by organisers, they shall wear it. Otherwise, they have to wear half or full shirt or coat with full pants, and an easily identifiable badge. Neck Tie is preferable.

9. Wearing shoes is a must in all

5. Selection of India Men Team for all official championships like Asian, World, Olympiad, etc., will be done on the following basis:
 - a. The National Champion plus the top four rated (published rating three months before the event). However, while computing the rating 75 ELO points will be added to all those who participated in the Premier / Challenger National Championships in the immediate previous year.
 - b. For other Tournaments in India & Abroad: Top six from National Premier (National 'A') ranking (no rating Criteria) will be considered.
6. Selection of India Women Team for all official championships like Asian, World, Olympiad, etc., will be done on the following basis:

those who participated in the Women Premier / Women Challenger National Championships in the immediate previous year"

b. For other Tournaments in India & Abroad: Top six from National Women Premier (National Women 'A') ranking (no rating Criteria) will be considered.

7. Commonwealth Championship:

National Premier (National 'A') Champion / National Women Premier (National Women 'A') Champion.

8. Asian Continental:

Grandmasters with 2500 ELO Rating in Open and Woman Grandmasters with 2200 ELO rating in Women category will be considered under Special entries for participation in the Asian Individual Chess Championship, even if they have not participated in the National Premier/ National Challenger in the immediate previous year. However, such ratings should reflect in the FIDE rating published three months before the start of the tournament".

Annexure IV: Code of Conduct for All Arbiters

1. Arbiters shall register with the All India Chess Federation through their respective State Associations by paying the Annual Registration Fee as prescribed by AICF financial regulation from time to time to be considered for appointment as arbiter in any

tournament.

2. Arbiters shall be unbiased in tournaments and they shall exhibit no nepotism or favouritism in delivering decisions.
3. Arbiters have to be thorough with Laws of Chess, Rating, Pairing and Title Regulations and other related topics.
4. Arbiters have to abide by the rules and regulations of All India Chess Federation and FIDE.
5. Arbiters shall obtain prior permission from All India Chess Federation (through their state associations) to serve tournaments in other countries.
6. An arbiter who wants to serve in tournaments held in states other than his own, has to get prior permission from his state association (through his district association) to do so.
7. Only qualified title holders shall serve as arbiters in tournaments. For state championships and state level tournaments, at least Senior National Arbiter title holders shall be appointed as Chief Arbiter. At State level tournament, the other arbiters should be atleast state level Arbiters. For rating tournaments, the chief arbiter shall be at least a FIDE arbiter.
8. Arbiters shall be in proper

Otherwise, they have to wear half or full shirt or coat with full pants, and an easily identifiable badge. Neck Tie is preferable.</p> <p>9. AGENDA 10: To discuss and decide on the show cause notice to Binoy Shah and his reply.

Decision:

The members unanimously decided not to accede to Binoy Shah's request. Further, the matter is also infructuous.

AGENDA 11: To consider confirmation of The Andhra Pradesh Chess Association affiliation

Decision:

Under Section 16 (b) (iii) of the Constitution and Bye laws of the All India Chess Federation, the members of the AGM unanimously decided to confirm the affiliation of the newly formed The Andhra Pradesh Chess Association. The newly elected President Mr. Ramarao and Secretary Mr. D. Srihari were introduced to the August gathering.

AGENDA 12: Any other matter with the permission of the Chair.

All the decisions taken by the Central Council, as given below, were ratified and approved by the General Body.

i). Manipur Chess Association – Y. Arun Singh issue:

Decision:

The decision arrived at the Central Council of the AICF earlier in the day, as given below, is unanimously ratified by the AGM.

"The Hon. Secretary informed the members that some of the dissatisfied members of the Manipur Chess Association joined together and conducted a meeting under the organisation called Chess Development Body in Manipur and elected set of office bearers on 16.04.2015. They have sent their proceedings to the All India Chess Federation with a request to recognise this as the office body of the Manipur Chess Association. However we received a letter from the recognised body for chess by AICF the Manipur Chess Association, through its Secretary R.K. Sanajoba Singh that the Manipur Chess Association has sent its new constitution (as per AICF's direction) to the Registrar of Societies to get their concurrence. After this they plan to conduct their elections. Mr. Sanajoba Singh informs the Federation that they have come to know that Y. Arun Singh who is the organising Secretary of the Manipur Chess Association has written to the District Registrar not to approve the Constitution and hence the whole matter is pending.

Three representatives from the rebel body namely Dr. R.K. Sanajoba, Thongam Nabachandra Singh and Yumnam Terakeshwar Singh who had come to Chennai were allowed by the Chair to present their case to the members of the Central Council.

After listening to them the Central Council decided not to take cognisance of the new group. However, at the request of the above three members of the rebel group it was decided that the President of AICF should depute a committee to visit Manipur and help to resolve the issue".

ii). L. Imocha letter requesting the upcoming Northeast championship to be declared as the 15th NE Chess Development Committee:

Decision:

The decision arrived at the Central Council of the AICF earlier in the day, as given below, is unanimously ratified by the AGM.

"The members agreed to Mr. Imocha's suggestion".





iii). National participation must to participate in International championship held in India:

Decision:

The decision arrived at the Central Council of the AICF earlier in the day, as given below, is unanimously ratified by the AGM.

"It was decided that even while participating in India in the official FIDE / Asian / Commonwealth Chess Championships the players should have participated in the respective age group / open National Championships which are the basis for selection".

iv). Overage players should play in open tournament only:

Decision:

The decision arrived at the Central Council of the AICF earlier in the day, as given below, is unanimously ratified by the AGM.

"It was brought to the attention of the members that AICF had not taken any decision regarding the participation of the players who have been found over aged medically. After discussion it was decided that all players who have been found over aged will not be allowed to participate in any age related tournaments after they serve their punishment. However, those who agree to the results of the medical test and submit the original Date of Birth to the satisfaction of the AICF, will be allowed to play in their age group after serving their suspension".

v). Staff will be allowed interest free loan against ESS:

Decision:

The decision arrived at the Central Council of the AICF earlier in the day, as given below, is unanimously ratified by the AGM.

"It was decided to permit Staff of AICF to avail interest free loan from their own Employees Saving Scheme upto 90% of their savings and the same to be recovered in 24 monthly instalments from their Salaries".

ANNUAL REPORT 2015 - 2016

Dear Friends,

The year 2015 - 2016 has been very productive in so many facets of the All India Chess Federation. Be it in the number of Championship medals, increase in the number of registered players with FIDE, increase in the number of Grandmasters, Ranking of the Indian men and women in FIDE, increase in the number of FIDE Rated players the All India Chess Federation saw a quantum jump. With the above statistics, I present the Annual report of our activities for the year 2015 - 2016 to this august body.

There were some spectacular performances by our players both at the Asian and World forums. The Federation was very active and a record 236 tournaments were rated by the FIDE of which 17 were International open tournaments. All the National Championships were held as planned and the players were selected to represent India on the basis of the performances in these championships. As a result of all these, we have as on 31.03.2016 42 Grandmasters, 89 International Masters, 15 Women Grandmasters (including GMs, IMs and FMs), 29 Women International Masters, 54 FIDE Masters, 29 Women FIDE Masters, 29 Candidate Masters, 16 Woman Candidate Masters, 2 FIDE Senior Trainers, 22 FIDE Trainers, 39 FIDE Instructors, 34 National Instructors and 89 Developmental Instructors. We are now ranked 5 in the Men FIDE ranking list and 5 in the women also which is an all time record. The number of FIDE registered players has increased to 55599 from 46726. Incidentally our Federation is number one in FIDE in respect of the number of registered players. The number of players currently rated are 20983 as on 31.03.2016. The number of players registered with AICF is 18426.

The Federation also took efforts in substantially increasing the technical force which is very important to carry on the activities of the Federation to the next level. We have now increased the strength of our technical team - 111 International Arbiters and 138 FIDE Arbiters.

The game of chess has spread all over the country, thanks to the active support of 33 affiliated units and 12 Institutional members along with thousands of subsidiary units functioning under these entities. It is evident that the activities all over India gained momentum as 236 tournaments were rated by the FIDE out of which 193 tournaments were FIDE rated tournaments, the rest being National Championships, Commonwealth Chess Championship and Open Grandmasters tournaments. Tamil Nadu State Chess Association, Delhi Chess Association, Venus Chess Academy, Mumbai and All Orissa Chess Association were instrumental in organising International Grandmaster tournaments thus making it possible for our players to get FIDE title norms. We should also



appreciate the following State Associations for facilitating rating tournaments – Tamilnadu 44, Maharashtra 43, Karnataka 13, Delhi 12, Kerala 12, West Bengal 12, Orissa 10, Andhra Pradesh 7, Assam 6, Goa 6, Uttar Pradesh 6, Gujarat 4, Telangana 4, Jharkhand 3, Rajasthan 3, Chandigarh 2, Madhya Pradesh 2, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Mizoram, Pondicherry each 1 making it a total of 193.

It is no wonder that after each year, it is seen that the All India Chess Federation is growing in stature due to sustained work put in by all the stake holders like the State Associations, organizers of various tournaments, the coaches, the academies, the arbiters, the players supported by many State Governments and especially the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India / Sports Authority of India. Added to these, is a bunch of dedicated set of office bearers of the Federation who leave no stone unturned to run the Federation as per its objectives. The office bearers have been fortunate enough to have hard working Secretarial staff and the guidance of its President Mr.P.R.Venketrama Raja.

All these things have resulted in some spectacular performances by our players who continued the good legacy that has been established, especially from 2005, and have made us proud by their outstanding performances both at the Asian and World forums. All the National Championships were held as planned and the players were selected to represent India on the basis of the performances in these championships.

Thanks to the organisation of so many tournaments, the chess players benefited immensely by way of prize money to the tune of Rs.4,56,27,500/-. Of these, Rs.3,52,37,500/- were given as prize money in all the rating tournaments put together, Rs.45,90,000/- was given as prize money in all the National Championships and Rs.58,00,000/- was given as prize money in all the Grandmaster tournaments.

As usual the Federation organized one official FIDE championship, namely Commonwealth Chess Championship which was organised at Delhi by the Delhi Chess Association from 22nd to 30th June, 2015. The tournament was a resounding success. Due to bringing such tournaments to India, the AICF has helped hundreds of our players to participate or otherwise they would have to travel abroad spending huge money to participate in such tournaments.

The highlight of the year was the winning of 11 medals, the highest by any country, in the World Youth and Cadet Chess Championship held at Greece, out of which were five gold medals three silver and three bronze medals. The All India Chess Federation organised a wonderful felicitation function for these medal winners and distributed mementos and cash awards to the tune of Rs.6 lakhs. Mr. Onkar Kedia, I.A.S., Joint Secretary, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, our President Mr.Venketrama Raja and Mr.D.V.Sundar, Vice President FIDE graced the occasion and distributed the awards to the talented children.

The vision of AICF to make India the strongest chess playing country in the world is set to become a reality. India is now ranked no.1 in the number of FIDE registered players, 55599 as per FIDE. We have surpassed giants like Russia 52936, France 43175, Spain 37925, Germany 31290 as on 31.03.2016. Thanks



to the continued support of the Government we were able to provide our players with all possible foreign exposure and also give them intensive coaching under eminent and renowned chess trainers.

The Federation was very responsible and did not spare the guilty and took action under its constitution wherever necessary. As usual the Federation created an opportunity to players who did not have their births registered within one year, to get their age related test done at Chennai. 25 players made use of this opportunity and cleared their age related issue.

Financially, the AICF has stabilized its funds position and we are comfortable. It is our desire to have a very healthy bank balance so that we can increase our chess development programs without any financial constraints.

The Federation fulfilled all the requirements under our Constitution and Bye laws and have filed our annual documents with statutory authorities like the Registrar of Societies, Tamilnadu, the Income Tax authorities and also with the Government of India. We had conducted 4 Central Council meetings and one Annual General Body Meeting as prescribed under the Constitution.

We list below our notable achievements during the year that has gone by:

World Team Championship 2015 held at Tsakhkadzor, Armenia from 18th to 29th April 2015.



Olympiad champions China defeated India 3-1 in the final round to win the World Team Chess Championship that concluded at Armenia on April 28, 2015.

Two defeats in the last two rounds cost India dearly in the placing scale. India stayed on seven points and were pushed to ninth place. India had finished third at best in this edition many years back when China withdrew in the last moment and India was given their slot.

India won three matches, lost five and drew one for seven points. Three players, Sethuraman (-16.5), Sasikiran (-7.9) and Deep Sengupta (-4.9) are losing while Harikrishna (+2.2) and Vidit Gujrathi (+13) are gaining Elo.

The scores: Harikrishna 5/9, Sethuraman 2.5/9, Sasikiran 3/8, Vidit Gujrathi 4.5/7 and Deep Sengupta 1/3. Four defeats in the last five games should be a



shock to coach Grand Master R.B. Ramesh. India had finished with the bronze medal at Tromso 2014.

The results (round 8): India lost to Armenia 1.5-2.5; Egypt lost to Russia 0.5-3.5; Israel drew Hungary 2-2; Ukraine lost to USA 1.5-2.5; Cuba lost to China 1-3.

The results (round 9): China beat India 3-1; USA beat Cuba 3-1; Hungary drew Ukraine 2-2; Russia beat Israel 2.5-1.5; Armenia beat Egypt 2.5-1.5.

Women's World Team Championship 2015 held at Chengdu, China from 18th to 29th April, 2015.

India Finish fourth at World Women's Team Championship



On second ever appearance, India improved its performance from seventh place recorded in 2009 to fourth place in 2015 in the World Women's Team Chess Championship that ran from April 17-29, 2015 at Chengdu, China.

India played in the World Women's Team Chess Championship as a FIDE President's entry, thanks to Mr.D.V.Sundar, Vice President, FIDE. In the end, our players justified that selection by winning four matches, drawing two and losing three to take the creditable fourth place.

Harika won silver medal for second board and Humpy won the bronze medal for top board.

Indian individual scores in board order: Humpy 5.5/9, Harika 5.5/8, Padmini Rout 4.5/8, Soumya Swaminathan 4.5/7, Mary Ann Gomes 2/4. Delhi International Master Vishal Sareen was the coach of the team.

Final placings: 1 Georgia 17/18; 2 Russia 15; 3 China 11; 4 India 10; 5 Ukraine 10; 6 Kazakhstan 9; 7 Armenia 7; 8 Poland 6; 9 USA 5; 10 Egypt 0.



World Youth U-16 Chess Olympiad 2015 held at Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia from 19th to 29th August 2015.

India wins silver after dramatic tie for first place



There was a four-way tie for the first place and it was Iran, India (silver), Russia and Hungary finishing in that order.

Margins were narrow with only Aravindh winning and the other games were drawn. Vaishali, Sai Vishwesh and Ritviz drew for India's silver medal.

India lost one match, won seven and drew two for the second place. Defending champions played well as fourth seed and to finish second and they had done well on that count.

Special mention has to be made about Grandmaster R.B.Ramesh who was the coach of the team which really helped our players to finish on the podium.

Scorers: Vr Aravindh Chithambaram 7/9, R Vaishali 7/10, C Sai Vishwesh 6.5/10, Parab Ritviz 4.5/6, Al Muthaiah 4/5. In rating terms, the rating performance of all our players except Sai Vishwesh was better than expected.

Final placings (tie-break order): 1-4. Iran, India, Russia, Hungary 16/20; 5 China-1 14; 6-7. Uzbekistan, China-2 12 each; 8-15. Canada, Zavkhan, Mongolia, Turkey, MGL Team F, Kyrgyzstan, MGL Team A, France 11 each...35 teams.

World Cup 2015 held at Baku, Azerbaijan from 10th September to 5th October 2015.

Sergey Karjakin wins FIDE World Cup 2015





Sergey Karjakin and Peter Svidler played to finally decide the FIDE World Cup winner in quick-play tie-breaks. After the games with the classical time control the result was even 2-2. Karjakin won both blitz games and emerged winner of the 2015 FIDE World Cup!

World Rapid and Blitz Championships 2015 held at Berlin, Germany from 9th to 15th October 2015.

Magnus Carlsen wins FIDE World Rapid Championship



Magnus Carlsen convincingly won the 2015 FIDE World Rapid Chess Championship by concluding the event with 11,5/15 points, a full point ahead of the nearest followers. Carlsen retained the title that he won in 2014 in Dubai, UAE.

World Youth and Cadets Championships 2015 held at Halkidiki, Greece from 24th October to 6th November 2015.

India Win Five World Titles in WYCC (5 gold, 3 silver, 3 bronze, wins best country award)



India gave out a strong historic performance in the World Youth Chess Championship that concluded at Porto Carras in Greece on November 5, 2015.

The Indian number of 2015 equaled the titles won in 2006 but in fact this one at Greece should be weighed higher since Russia did not participate in Batumi 2006.



Titles were won by R Praggnanandhaa (Open U-10), Bharath Subramaniam H (Open U-8), M Mahalakshmi (Girls U-18), R Vaishali (Girls U-14) and Rakshitta Ravi (Girls U-10). By virtue of winning the Under – 18 World Title M.Mahalakshmi will be awarded the WIM title apart from WGM norm

Mahalakshmi was previously Under-14 champion in 2012, Vaishali was previously Under-10 champion in 2012 and Praggnanandhaa was previously Under-8 champion. Bharath and Rakshitta are tasting their maiden titles. Vaishali and Praggnanandhaa are sister and brother while Rakshitta is daughter of IM T.S. Ravi and WIM Sai Meera Ravi.

India could have got more but Nihal Sarin figured in a tie for the first place but was pushed to silver in the Open Under-12 section. Last year, Nihal had won the Under-10 title.

In the medals statistics chart, India won five gold, three silver and three bronze while no other nation won more than one gold. India by its tall performance has completely dwarfed the rest of the chess world. Silver medals were won by Nihal Sarin (Open U-12), Dev Shah (Open U-8) and V Varshini (Girls U-18). Bronze medals went to Vantika Agrawal (Girls U-14), Saina Salonika (Girls U-12), Divya Deshmukh (Girls U-10). Eleven medals by a 50-player contingent is an excellent showing by the Indians.



The All India Chess Federation felicitated the 11 medal winners in the World Youth and Candidates Chess Championship at Halkidiki in Greece at the Concert Hall of the Russian Centre for Science and Culture, New Delhi. There was Governmental participation at the function with Shri.Onkar Kedia, I.A.S, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, gracing the function as Chief Guest. Shri.Venketrama Raja, President, All India Chess Federation and Shri.D.V. Sundar, Vice President, FIDE, Shri. V. Hariharan, Secretary, AICF, Shri. Bharat Singh, CEO, AICF, Shri. R.M. Dongre, Treasurer, AICF were present at the felicitation. Members who attended the Central Council also attended the function. Mr. Bharat Singh. CEO, welcomed the gathering, Chief Guest Shri. Onkar Kedia, Mr. Venketrama Raja, President AICF and Mr. D.V.Sundar, Vice President offered their felicitations to the medal winners.



Harika Dronavalli Wins 1st Women's 'Online' Blitz Championship



GM Harika Dronavalli won the first **FIDE World Online Women Blitz Championship**. The final was held on 24th September, 2015 with all participants together in Rome playing on laptops.

FIDE's online championship for women started with eight qualifier (Swiss) tournaments from June 2015 onwards, followed by a semifinal and a final tournament on 26 November 2015. The time control in all tournaments was three minutes for the game plus two seconds increment per move. One of the eight qualifiers was WGM Padmini Rout from India.

Eight players qualified for the final in Rome: Harika Dronavalli (India), Alexandra Kosteniuk (Russia), Olga Zimina (Italy), Irina Vasilevich (Russia), Sabina-Francesca Foisor (USA), Adriana Nikolova (Bulgaria), Padmini Rout (India), and Sofio Gvetadze (Georgia).

Two wild cards were added: Nana Dzagnidze (Georgia, nominated by the FIDE President) and Valentina Gunina (Russia, nominated by the Commission for Women's Chess).

The organizers thought it was a nice idea to invite the ten finalists and pay for their flights and hotels. As a result, the players were in a playing hall (the Circolo Canottieri Aniene in Rome), sitting at a table, facing each other, but with two laptops placed in between.

Asian Continental Championships 2015 held at Al Ain, UAE from 1st to 13th August, 2015.

Three Indians qualify for World Cup

The Asian Continental Chess Championships was a great success for Salem A R Saleh of United Arab Emirates and WIM Mitra Hejazipour of Iran. In men or open section, India recorded a big success picking up three of the five World Cup qualifying slots.

GM Surya S Ganguly, GM Sethuraman and GM Vidit Gujrathi qualified while Abhijeet Gupta lost and missed while GM Sasikiran drew top seed and missed



qualifying. GM Salem A R Saleh and Ganguly tied for first with 7/9 each. For the third place, Sethuraman, Vidit and Jianchao (Chn) scored 6½ and qualified for the FIDE World Cup.

The Women's section did not end well for the Indians. China's Shen Yang spoilt Vijayalakshmi's event. Mitra Hejazipour and Shen Yang tied for first on 7/9. Of the three Indians in the top three boards, Pratyusha drew Saduakassova (Kaz) while Mary Ann and Vijayalakshmi lost. Vijayalakshmi and Pratyusha finished third and fourth with 6½. WIM Pratyusha had a better rating performance than Mitra and made a WGM result. Champion Mitra Hejazipour lost two games. Both were to Indians – Padmini Rout and Vijayalakshmi.

More Indians finished in the top at Al-Ain than the start rank and it was a success. We did better than China taking six of the top ten places in men/open.

Asian Youth U8, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18 Championship 2015 held at Suwon, South Korea from 3rd to 11th August, 2015

India's rich haul at the Asian Youth





India impressed in the Asian Youth Chess Championship as was expected. India won more medals than all nations. India took five gold, five silver and seven bronze medals in the Asian Youth Chess Championship that concluded at Suwon in South Korea on August 10, 2015.

Overall, India picked up 17 out of the 36 medals on the table that is very close to the 50% mark. Iran took four gold, two silver and one bronze for a tally of seven medals. Vietnam won four medals, one gold, two silver and one bronze.

China won two medals, one gold, one silver. Uzbekistan picked up two medals, one gold and one bronze. Mongolia took three medals, two silver and once bronze. Kazakhstan won a solitary bronze medal. The show was organised by the Korea Chess Federation.

Players like Divya Deshmukh of Nagpur, R Vaishali of Chennai have won both Asian and World Age Group competitions. They are both hard and systematic workers. Vaishali won by the widest of margins. Champions Bharath Subramaniam (Open U-8), Aakanksha (Girls U-16) and Krishna Teja (Open U-18) are names we are going to read more in the future.

Many Indians like Shahil Dey (Open U-8), Arjun Erigaisi (Open U-12), Chandreyee Hajra (Girls U-16) tasted moments in the lead but could not win Gold this time. They are likely to make it big in the future. India's IA M.S. Gopakumar of Delhi was the Chief Arbiter.

The silver lining of our performance was that of S.L. Narayanan (in the Open) and Ivana Furtado (in Girls) who won silver medals. P.V.Nandhidhaa picked up the bronze medal.

Besides the classical controls, the event is held in rapid and blitz also. In the rapid, Parnali (Girls) and Chakravarthi Reddy (Open) won silver medals. Ivana Furtado won the silver medal in the blitz section in girls. Overall, it was a silver finish for the Indians in this edition.

International events conducted:

We successfully organized 5 major International events in 2015 - 2016 apart



from organizing Commonwealth Chess Championship held at New Delhi from 22nd to 30th June, 2015. We organized 4 Grandmasters International tournaments namely Odisha International Open Grandmaster Chess Tournament at Odisha, 8th Mumbai Mayors Cup International Open Chess Tournament at Mumbai, Delhi Open Chess Tournament at Delhi and Chennai Open Chess Tournament at Chennai.

By organising these International events our players were able to rub shoulders with the talents from other countries. Without spending much money, if they had to go abroad, they were able to enjoy International exposure. These tournaments have helped our players to garner FIDE Title norms like GM, WGM, IM, WIM norms etc.

AICF Chronicle:

The monthly official magazine of the Federation "AICF Chronicle" edited by C.G.S.Narayanan, features reports, final standings and annotated games of various tournaments organized all over the country along with photographs of important events. It also presents fact files of Indian Grandmasters / International Masters / Woman Grandmasters / International Arbiters, international news of interest, end games studies, middle game tactics, portraits on masters of the past, articles on chess problems and Tournament Calendar. The members were requested to download the magazine from the Federation's official website www.indianchessfed.org as limited copies are printed for circulation to affiliated units and institutions.

NOTES ON ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31.03.2016

1. Significant Accounting Policies

- 1.1. The Financial statements of the Association are prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India.
 - 1.2. The Accounting Policies adopted in preparation of financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year except for change in accounting policy for Depreciation which is provided as per the provisions of the Income Tax Act as against provision on WDV method.
 - 1.3. Depreciation has been provided on WDV method and at the rates under the Income Tax Act.
 - 1.4. Revenue is recognized based on nature of activity when revenue can be reasonably measured and there exists reasonable certainty of its recovery. Interest income on Fixed deposits is accounted as per statements furnished by the Banks. Other revenue is accounted net of related expenses.
 - 1.5. Fixed Assets are carried at cost less depreciation. The cost of fixed asset comprises of its purchase price net of trade discounts and rebates.
 - 1.6. Foreign exchange transactions are recognized at the rates prevalent on the date of transaction. Loss/profit is recognized at the time of actual realization. Monetary items of assets and liabilities at the end of the year are stated at the rates prevalent on the closing date.
 - 1.7. Government grants towards conduct of national and international tournaments and expenses of Indian players in foreign countries are recognized as income on realization.
 - 1.8. Impairment of assets is recognized based on yearly review.
 - 1.9. Contingent liabilities are not recognized and disclosed.
2. Opening balances for the year 2004-05 are not available as the relevant books and other records are not received from the erstwhile office bearers and hence statement of affairs is prepared.
3. Income & Expenditure account & the Statement of affairs prepared as on 31/03/16 represent transactions that have taken place during the year 2015-16. Income & Expenditure do not include air tickets provided by the Government directly to the players.
4. The Federation has preferred suit before the Madras High Court for recovery of a sum of about Rs.1, 11, 12,831/- from Mr. P T Unnikrishnan Koya and others towards the moneys belonging to the Federation.
5. The Income Tax department had completed assessment for the assessment years 2008-10, 2010-11, 2011-12, 2012-13 & 2013-14. The income earned by the Association from Donations and certain other receipts were considered as receipts in the nature of commercial nature. As a result the entire surplus earned by the society is brought to tax.


