

AGENDA 5: To consider and approve the annual report for the year 2011 - 12.

#### Decision:

The Hon. Secretary read the operational portions of the Annual Report which is given below:

The new set of office bearers took over the reigns of our Federation with Mr.J.C.O.Prabhakar of Taminique as the President, Mr.Bharat Singh se from Secretary and Mr.R.M. Dungre as Treasurer along with 6 Vice Presidents and 6 Jams Secretaries from 30,05 2011 powards. Mr.J.C.D. Prabhakar is an ardent Sports lover and a very keen these promoter. To recall our memory, it was he who lead from the frent to honour and falicitate Grandmaster Visity Anand when he won the World Crown for the first time in 2000. He wanted to see the World Champion as a King and in pursuit of this he donated a Gold plated Siver Crown and a Mare and paraded from on a chariot.

It was indeed a very humpling moment to your Secretary when the responsibility was thrust on him by the members of the All India Chess Federation to which he is grateful. The new office bearers realize that it will take very sincere attempts to match the results of our predicessor Secretary Mr.D.V. Sundar and President Mr.N. Scholaran who set bench mark in Sports administration. We the new office biggress place on record that we have inherited a trebsure in the form of good governance, transparent and vibrant ALCF.

With thirst sentiments, I present the Annual import of our activities for the year 2011 - 2012 to this august body. There were some spectacular performances by our players both at the Asian and World forums. The Federation was very active and 135 tournaments were rated by the FIDE of which 6 were International open tournaments. Apart from this several children tournaments are organised throughout the Country by various State Accountions & Academies particularly for School Children, We organized World Junior Chess Championships at Chennal and Asian Schools Chess Championships at New Daily, 4d the National Championships were hold as planned and the players were selected to represent India on the basis of the performances in these championships. As a result of all these, we have alpresent 26 Grand Masters, 76 International Masters, 8 Women Grand Masters, 17 Women International Masters, 43 FIDE Masters, 22 Women Fible Masters, 14 Candidate Masters, 5 Wilman Candidate Masters, 59 International Arbiters and 56 FIDE Arbiters. We are now ranked #7" in the FIDE ranking list both among men and women. The number of FIDE registered payers has increased to 23,636 from 18,000 and the number of players currently rated is 8192 as of 01.03.2012. The number of players registered with AICF is 10,108.

I am proud to announce that our Federation is one of the leading National Sports Federation which encourages our players by offering huge Prior mores by organises various tournaments. For instance, our players were given 85.2.06.44,505 as prior money during the year 2011 - 2012. Very few federation can match one.

With 32 affiliated units and 13 Institutional members with thousands of subsidiary units functioning under these entities the game of chess is thus social through the length and breadth of the country which hops, the federation in furthering as



cause. The activities from all over India gained momentum as 135 tournaments were rated by the FIDE out of which 95 tournaments were FIDE rated tournaments. Mr.D.V. Sundar, Mr.B. Marat Singh, Mr.K.V.V. Surma, Mr.R. M. Dongre Mr.S. C. Sahu and Airport Authority of India were instrumental in organizing international Grandmaster tournaments thus making it possible for our players to get FIDE title narms. We should also appreciate the following State Associations for facilitating rating tournaments – Tamilinadu (25), Maharashtra (15), Kerala (9), Andhra Pradesn (7), Kamataka (7), West Bengal (6), Deibi (5), Gujarat (4), Iharkhand (3), Orisia (3), Assam (3), Goa (2), Uttar Pradesn (2), Bihar, Chandigam, Haryana, Jamesu & Kashmir, Pondicherry, Punjab, Rajasthan Leach making it a total of 95.

The vision of AICF to make India the strongest chass playing country in the world is set to become a reality.

Thanks to the continued support of the Government we were able to provide our players with all possible foreign exposure and also give them intensive coarring under eminent and world renowned chaos trainers from abread.

The list of achievements by our players given below gives an insight into Inda's emerging stature in the Chess world. We won the World U-12 title through Taminadu youngster Karthikeyan Mural. We had a good sarvest of FIDE titles this year with 2 GMs, 6 IMs, 2 FMs, 1 WFM, 2 GMs, 2 WCMs in our kitty.

In our endeavor to increase the base of qualified Arbitars & Coaches. We had conducted FIDE Arbitar Seminar at Chennal from 06" to 09" January, 2012 and FIDE Trainer's Seminar at Delhi from 16" to 22" January, 2012 with the help of FIDE and Asian Chess Federation. For both these seminars we had instructions from abroad to impart knowledge and to conduct the test. Thanks to this we have more number of FIDE Arbitars and FIDE Trainers from our Country.

We have stabilized our funds position and we look comfortable. We have saved #s.3.10 Crores to the end of March 2012 by way of Fixed Deposits and it is our desire to have a very healthy bank belance so that we can increase our chesk development programs without any financial constraints."

The members expressed happiness and placed on record their appreciation to all the players, organisers, coaches for doing excellent job and bringing good name to our Federation and our Country. The Annual report recommended by Central Council was unanimously approved by the General Body.

AGENDA 8: Sri Bikrant Keshari Biswal father of Gitashree Biswal player had appealed to the General Body of AICF against the decision of the Central Council of the All India Chess Federation imposing a penalty on his daughter for flaunting false age. It was decided to place the matter before the next General Body meeting of AICF as requested by him. (The player has since moved the Court and obtained a stay).

#### Decision

The Secretary informed the members that the player was found overaged by the medical report and suspended for two years by the Central Council on 30.09.2011. The father has now appealed to the AGM for reconsidering the above suspension. But however, the player has since moved the Court and obtained a Stay. We are taking steps to vacate the stay. In view of the above, since the matter is subjudice, it was decided to wait for the outcome of the court case.

#### AGENDA 9: Adyasha Pattanaik - To discuss and decide.

#### Decision

The members were informed that the player Advente Pattames, win suspended by the All India Chiess Federation at its Central Council meeting on 30,09,2011 and the same was communicated to the player through the All Oriesa State Chess Association by letter dated 13.12.2011. The father of the player Stirl Annada Presad Pattenails has since appealed by letter dated 24.04.2012 to the General Body praying that the impugned Medical Report and the Penalty may be quastied, and the player should be allowed to participate in all tournaments holding her date of birth as 10:11:2000. Further in his letter be has alleged that the player was not communicated regarding the above suspension and that he received the medical certificate only a week before. But the Hon, Secretary informed the members that the parent is lying because the mother of the girl knew that her daughter was suspended for two years. For this purpose she came all the way to Delhi and met him during the Parsynath International Grandmaster tournament which was held at Delhi from 15" to 23" January, 2017, specially to request him to allow her daughter to play in all tournaments. She also produced documents





like her Marriage Invitation and Vaccination card as a proof of her daughter's age and requested him to accept this and lift the suspension lift on suspicion, the Secretary said, as informed the Central council on 31.03.2012, he forwarded the documents to an approved forensic expects Sparkle Institute of Science and India the report of which was placed to the Central council for information. The report indicated that some of the documents are fabricated. Hence, it is wrong to blame AICF of any wrong doing. The members appreciated the work done by the Secretary and placed on record that he had dealt the entire issue transparently and in a very fair manner. The members did not accept the contents of the perent that Transparency and fair play in dealing the matter has not at all been maintained."

The members felt that the All India Chess Federation had followed the Rules of the Federation and the Government of India guidelines on such age related issues in letter and spirit and hence the suspension of the player based upon the medical report is valid and enforceable. The members noted that the parent has not submitted any tangible proof to prove that the player was born on 10.11.2000.

It was resolved that due to the above mentioned reasons the appeal from Annada Prasad Pattanaik is rejected.

For the General Body Meeting and EC / MC, apart from the district delegates the office bearers are entitled to vote. However, for the elections to the office bearers, only the two delegates may be allowed to vote.


### AGENDA 11: Chess Olympiad - Coaching Camp.

#### Decision:

The Secretary informed the members that ALEF conducts coaching camps employing Foreign Coaches for our Men & women teams prior to the Chess Olympiads. This year also we planned for such camps at Chennal & Delhi towards preparations of our teams in the Chess Olympiad to be held at Istanbul during August. In this connection we also applied to Government of India for financial assistance which includes expenses to be incurred on foreign coaches.

Interestingly, while talking to players it looks that most them are not interested in coaching camps; some of them feel it is not useful; and some of them have their own priorities. Hence the camp may not have full strength & it will be meaningless to have camps for just two or time players. The members agreed that we cannot have camps under these conditions.

The Secretary further informed the members that one of the player Hankrishna has asked for Single room facility during the Olympiad at AICF





expense. AICF can not extend such facility to any single player as we are sure, once extended to him, others also will put in their demands. The AICF can not extend such facility to the whole contingent of nearly 12 members including the coaches. He recalled that whenever Anand or Sasikiran out for single room they pay for it. The members felt that Harikrishna also can be permitted to have single room for which he has to pay.

His request for single room at AICF expense was rejected by the General Body.

# AGENDA 12: Appeal by D.K.Gupta to revoke his suspension - To decide

#### Decision:

D.K. Gupta has preferred an appeal to the General Body requesting for litting his suspension.

The members were informed that Mr.D.K. Gupta after the suspension has been indulging in AICF activities much more vigorously. He was part of the Chess Association of India who have been projecting themselves as parallel body to the All India Chess Federation. He has been helping them in organising various tournaments which have been declared unauthorised by the All India Chess Federation. Further, he has a website and through which he has been continuously posting messages just to malign the good name of the Federation and its office bearers. He does not own his mistakes nor he repents for the same.

The General Body rejected his appeal to lift his suspension.

#### AGENDA 13: Amendments to Financial Regulations.

#### Decision:

Financial Regulations as recommended by the Central Council was approved unanimously. The new Regulations are enclosed.

AGENDA 14: Conduct of National Championships - Review and changes if any to be made.

#### Decision:

The recommendations of the Central Council was adopted unanimously as given below:

The members approved of inclusion of the National Amateur Championship (for players below 2000 Elo) which will form the basis for considering players participation in World / Asian Amateur Chess Championship.



The Secretary informed the members that the National Premier Chess Championship is not attracting our top players and hence the National Championship is suffers on stature. Therefore, he has come up with the new format with increased Prize money for the players. The Current Prize money is Rs.4/- lakhs and he suggested that the new prize money should be Rs.10/- lakhs out of which the AICF will fund Rs.6/- lakhs to the organiser. For the Women, the current prize money is Rs.2.5/- lakhs and the suggested amount is Rs.6/- lakhs out of which AICF will fund Rs.3.5/- lakhs. The players representing the Institution members will have to take care of their own Board & lodge and the players representing State Associations will be provided by the organisers with Rs.10,000/- towards board & lodge. In view of this, the Secretary informed the members that there needs to be a change in format of the Championship as we cannot have 55 players (with many of them with low ELO rating, as it will not be good for high rated players). After this the members approved the new format for organising the National Premier Chess Championship and also identifying players to represent India in International tournaments.

Henceforth the National Premier Chess Championship will be a 14 player Round Robin championship. Henceforth, the immunity for players above 2650 ELO is withdrawn in other words players desirous of representing the Country should necessarily participating the National Premier Chess Championship. The exception is given only to the World Champion and World Championship Challenger.

As per the new format 9 Players from the immediate past National Challengers, 4 top ELO Rated players and the National Champion. If the National Champion is one among the top 4 ELO rated, then 10 players from the National Challengers will qualify. For selection of Indian team in Team Championships.

Likewise the National Women Premier Chess Championship will be a 12 player Round Robin championship. Henceforth, the immunity for players above 2500 ELO is withdrawn in other words players desirous of representing the Country should necessarily participating the National Women Premier Chess Championship. The exception is given only to the World Champion and World Championship Challenger.

As per the new format 8 Players from the immediate past National Women Challengers, 3 top ELO Rated players and the National Champion. If the National Champion is one among the top 3 ELO rated, then 9 players from the National Women Challengers will qualify. For selection of Indian team in Team Championships.

The Average rating of the immediate past two FRLs will be taken into consideration while finalising the Indian team.

The above will come into operation from 2013 National Championships.

# ANNUAL REPORT 2012 - 2013

Dear Friends,

It is with great pleasure I present the Annual report of our activities for the year 2012 – 2013 to this august body. Year after year it is seen that the All India Chess Federation is growing in stature due to some sustained work put in by all the stake holders like the State Associations, organizers of various tournaments, the coaches, the academies, the arbiters, the players supported by many State Governments and especially the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt, of India. Added to these, is a bunch of dedicated set of office bearers of the Federation who have not left one stone unturned to run the Federation as per its objectives. The office bearers have been fortunate enough to have hard working Secretarial staff and the guidance of its President Mr.J.C. D.Prabhakar.

All these things have resulted in some spectacular performances by our players at the domestic, Asian and World forums. The Federation was very active and a record 188 tournaments were rated by the FIDE of which 46 were official mandatory International championships and Grandmaster tournaments. All the National Championships were held as planned and the players were selected purely on merit to represent India on the basis of the performances in these championships. As a result of all these we have at present 31 Grandmasters, 78 International Masters, 8 Women Grand Masters, 19 Women International Masters, 43 FIDE Masters, 26 Women FIDE Masters, 14 Candidate Masters, 5 Woman Candidate Masters, 95 International Arbiters and 95 FIDE Arbiters. We are now ranked 8 in the Men and 5 in the women in the FIDE ranking list. India occupies third position in the Number of FIDE registered players published by FIDE. The number of FIDE registered players has increased to 29550 from 23636 and the number of players currently rated is 9984 as on 31.03.2013. The number of players registered with AICF for the year in focus is 11,148.

With 32 affiliated units and 13 Institutional members with thousands of subsidiary units functioning under these entities the game of chess is thus spread all over the country which helps the Federation in furthering its cause. The activities from all over India gained momentum as 188 tournaments were rated by the FIDE out of which 113 tournaments were FIDE rated tournaments. Mr.Bharat Singh, Mr.R.M.Dongre, Mr.S.C.Sahu, Mr.D.V.Sundar, Mr. Manoj Itkelwar, Mr.K.V.V.Sarma, and Mr.Soumen Majumdhar were instrumental in organizing International Grandmaster tournaments thus making it possible for our players to get FIDE title norms. We should also appreciate the following State Associations for facilitating rating tournaments — Tamilnadu (29), Maharashtra (16), Karnataka (10), Kerala (10), Andhra Pradesh (9), Kolkata (8), Delhi (5), Gujarat (5), Orissa (5), Goa (2), Haryana (2), Jammu & Kashmir (2), Madhya Pradesh (2), Uttar Pradesh (2), Jharkhand, Pondicherry, Punjab, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Uttranchal each making it a total of 112.

The vision of AICF to make India the strongest chess playing country in the world is set to become a reality. Thanks to the continued support of the Government we were able to provide our players with all possible foreign exposure.

To equip our coaches, we had conducted FIDE Arbiter Seminar at Delhi and FIDE coaching seminar at Chennai with the help of FIDE and Asian Chess Federation. For both these seminars we had instructors from abroad to impart knowledge and to conduct the test. Thanks to this we have more number of FIDE Coaching officials and FIDE Arbiters from our Country.



FIDE has a ambitious program called the "Chess in Schools" program and we did not lag behind in spreading this throughout India. To begin with we invited Mr.Kevin O' Connell the Secretary of Chess in Schools program of FIDE to India who conducted clinics at 3 centres namely Chennai, Jalgoan, Delhi. Further, to take it forward the Federation invited FIDE Vice President and Chairman Chess in Schools program of FIDE Mr.Ali Nihat Yahiizi to India who visited Pane, Hyderabad and Delhi. On the financial front, we have stabilized our funds position and we look comfortable. We have saved close to nearly Rs.4 Crores at the end of March 2013 by way of Fixed Deposits and it is our desire to have a very healthy bank balance so that we can increase our chess development programs without any financial constraints. We list below our notable achievements during the year that has gone by:

# Asian Continental Championships 2012 held at Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam from 04th to 14th May, 2012.

Delhi Grand Master Parimarjan Negi won the Asian Continental Chess Championship despite a final round setback at Ho Chi Minh City in Vietnam on May 13. Negiscored seven wins, lost two and finished on seven points in the nine-round Swiss format event for 71-players. He gets selected for the World Cup events of FIDE. Salem A.R. Saleh of the United Arab Emirates defeated Negi with a crisp king. side attack in the final round to take the third place. Negiwho became the youngest grandmaster early in his career, recorded a stunning 2755 Elo rating performance. It was a shocker for Negi in the last round as he misplayed a level position against Saleh from a Slav defense game. The middle game was intense after Saleh sacrificed a rook for a knight but the computer analysis suggested that it was an easy draw for Negi who lost his nerves. It was a day of heartbreaks for the other Indians.

Mary Ann Gomes spoilt her chances of the gold medal in the women's champion for which a draw was enough against Tan Zhongyi of China. The Kolkata-based girl instead lost from a balanced middle game and could only finish on 2nd spot with her best tiebreak. The Indian's hopes of a rare double did not materialise but it was nevertheless a remarkable performance from Mary Ann who has been in her best form lately.

# Asian Team Chess Championship held at Beijing, China from 15th to 26th May, 2012

#### Silver for Men, Bronze for Women

Indian men won the silver by a clear margin and our women won the bronze after tying for second place. China-1 won the Asian Team Championship that concluded at China onMay 26, 2012. They scored 3.5-0.5 against Mongolia in the ninth and final round.

India finished the way they started with a 4-0 sweep against Iraq. Sasikiran was rested. Harikrishna, Negi, Gupta and Gopal scored for the Indians. India won the silver medal remaining undefeated with six wins and three draws for 15 points.

Champions, China-1, scored 17 points with eight wins and one draw against India. The Asian Open team event was of nine rounds for 14 teams.

## Asian Junior U20 Championships 2012 held at Tashkent, Uzbekistan from 29th May to 08th June, 2012.

International Master Narayanan Srinath of Chennai and Woman FIDE Master Ivana Furtado of Goa won the Asian Junior Open and Girls Championship that concluded at Tashkent on June 7, 2012. Both the Indians champions also remained undefeated. Indians rule both the continent and the world in chess. N. Srinath, a former World Under-12 champion also got a Grand Master norm by winning his maiden title by a wide one point margin.





Ivana Furtado's win is a big boost to not only to India but also to Goan chess. She scored 7.5 points and remained undefeated. India's bigger hope, Bhakti Kulkarni, also from Goa, started as second seed but two early losses to Pon Krithikha and the top seed spoilt her tournament. Ivana stood tall, winning the last three rounds in a row. She is a former two-time World Under-8 champion. Rucha Pujari of Kolhapur fresh from winning the women's rating in Sangli won the bronze medal. She needed a last round win for the title but Saranya spoilt her party. Ivana also got her Woman Grand Master norm for this clear title.

## Asian Youth Chess Championships 2012 held at Hikkaduwa, Sri Lanka from 24th June to 1st July 2012.

A rich haul of medals was expected from the Indian contingent and the players did not disappoint as India won five gold, six silver and seven bronze medals in the Asian Youth Chess Championship that concluded at Hikkaduwa in

Sri Lanka on July 1, 2012. We are above others, means India continues to be a powerhouse in age group chess.

Overall, we won 18 medals from the possible 42, still way ahead of our rivals. Iran came close with 4 gold, 2 silver and 1 bronze, Vietnam (2, 2, 1) and China (2, 2, -). India had won the same number of medals in the rapid and classical section.

For the first time, two champions emerged from one family. Vaishali and her little brother Praggnanandhan won a gold each to push India ahead of the framians in the title count. Both are



students from the Bloom Chess Academy in Chennai. Last round misses saw S.L. Narayanan (U-16), Bhagyashree Patil (U-8, Girls), Lasya (U-16, Girls) and Ram Aravind (U-10) lose crucial title or medal opportunities. However, Girish Koushik (U-16), R Vaishali (U-12, girls), N Priyanka (U-10, girls), R Praggnanandhaa (U-8) and Sanskruti Wankhade (U-6, girls) won the gold medals for India in their respective sections. The silver medals were won by: P.V. Nandhidhaa (U-16, girls), M. Mahalakshmi (U-14, girls), Rakesh Kumar Jena (U-12), C Lakshmi (U-10, girls), Rindhiya (U-8, girls) and Vallabh Kavi (U-6).

Those who won bronze medal for India are: J Saranya (U-18, girls), Michelle Catherina (U-16, girls), Monnisha (U-14, girls), Karthikeyan Murali (U-14) C.M.N. Sunyuktha (U-12, girls), Rahul Srivatshav (U-10) and Rakshitta Ravi (U-8, girls). Among the team (counting best three player results) medals, India's dominance was very clear. We won nine gold and three silver from the 12 sections

#### Indians Win Six Sections In Blitz

Indian won six gold medals in the Asian Youth Chess Championship that concluded at Hikkaduwa, Sri Lanka with the blitz competitions on July 1 evening. Riding on the back of U. Ashwini's 7/7 sweep in the Under-14 section for girls, India dominated that entire section for a scintillating podium finish. Shoumi Mukherjee and M Mahalakshmi won the silver and bronze medals.

The gold medal winners for India in blitz: Sanskruti Wankhade (U-6, girls), Ram Aravind (U-10), N Priyanka (U-10, girls), R Vaishali (U-12, girls), U. Ashwini (U-14, girls) and J. Saranya (U-18, girls). India dominated the event in the final session of the blitz bagging 16 out of the 42 medals in the fray leaving less for the rest of the nations. In rapid chess we won 5-8-5 (gold/silver/bronze) and in classical we achieved 5-6-7.

The silver medals went to: Bala Kannamma (U-18, girls), Girish Koushik (U-16), Meenu Priya (U-16, girls), Karthikeyan Murali (U-14) and Shoumi (U-14, girls). The bronze medals went to: Vallabh Kavi (U-6), Aryan Shah (U-8), Mitrabha Guha (U-12), M. Mahalakshmi (U-14, girls), G Lasya (U-16, girls).



# Asian Schools Championships & U5 Kindergarten held at New Delhi, India from 13th to 20th December, 2012.

8th Asian Schools Chess Championship-2012 was organised at the Indira Gandhi Indoor Stadium, Delhi. 415 players from 11 different countries participated in this prestigious championship, which had three formats of Rapid, Standard and Blitz events and comprising of 37 categories.

In the Rapid event, Indians once again proved its growing superiority in the age group championships as they won 12 Gold, 11 Silver and 9 Bronze out of the 42 at stake.

It is an accepted fact that GM Viswanathan Anand is the greatest chess player of all time. Now, he has won the World Chess title for five times, each against a different opponent.



He had won the title in various formats and this is the first time that he won in tie-break and that was also new! Though he would have certainly loved to have finished Boris Gelfand in the classical games.

While his parents nurtured his early talent, his hard work and total dedication to the game has richly rewarded him since 2000 when he won the world title first time. No amount of praise is enough for this genius of our times. The Chennai-born drew the classical series 6-6 after coming from behind. He won game eight in just 17 moves, the shortest World Championship victory.

Anand also completed something which got missed out. He lost the tie-break in 1998 and that denied him becoming champion earlier. Now, he has completed the tie-break win too and has shown to the world that his nerves are that of steel.

In the rapid chess tie-break, one thing was clear. Gelfand's clock was always ticking and Anand's speedy play came in handy. When white had played the 56th move a draw was agreed and celebration began in India. Anand is greatest sportperson in India. Fifth time champion and has completed his "high five".



# World Junior U20 Championships 2012 held at Athens, Greece from 1st to 16th August, 2012

Though Sahaj Grover of India finished 16th with 8 points and Debashis Das was placed 61st with 6.5 points, both of them IM made GM norms. Sahaj achieved the third GM norm and became Grandmaster while Debashis Das made the maiden GM norm.













# World Chess Olympiad 2012 held at Istanbul, Turkey from 27th August to 10th September, 2012.

# Armenian Men, Russia Women Win Olympiad On Tie-break. Indian Women finish all time high on 4th position

Indian women finished all-time best fourth place with a final round 2.5-1.5 victory over France. Harika led from the front and defeated Almira Skripchenko in the top board. Tania Sachdev won a bronze medal for India in the third board. She scored 9/11 and shared the silver medal board prize on third board. Mary Ann Gomes last won a medal at Dresden in 2008. Harika 7/10; Karavade 3/8; Tania Sachdev 9/11; Mary Ann Gomes 4.5/8; Soumya Swaminathan 4.5/7. India won eight matches and lost two and drew one.





After Round 10, India was the only unbeaten team in the open section having won 3 & drawn 7 games. A win in the last round would have taken India to the top ten. But we suffered a defeat in the last round and it pushed us down to 35th (to be checked) out of 157 teams. This position does not reflect the good performance of our players. Sasikiran 4/10; Harikrishna 5.5/10; Negi 5.5/9; Abhijeet Gupta 7/9; G.N. Gopal 3.5/6. India won the first three matches, drew the next seven and lost the last match.

Though we did well, not winning in the end cost us dearly. Sasikiran was out of form, Harikrishna let go the good start and the best performer was Gupta. Negi played a shade lower and Gopal did what was expected from his rating. In rating performance scale, Nadezhda Kosintseva of Russia 8/9 was the best in women and Shakhriyar Mamedyarov of Azerbaijan 8.5/10 was the best overall in Open.

Armenia won their third Chess Olympiad title in the last four appearances. Russian women retained their title they won at home last year by sweeping Kazakhstan 4-0. The Istanbul Olympiad that ran from August 27 to September 9 saw one of the closest finishes in both sections of all time.





# World Youth U-16 Chess Olympiad 2012 held at Istanbul, Turkey from 28th August to 6th September 2012.

#### India Wins Bronze at Istanbul

For the third place India, the former champions, was a huge favourite before the final round and a 2,5-1,5 win against Australia-A was more than enough to secure the bronze. All in all the World U-16 Olympiad saw many exciting games of good quality and a heart-stopping finish. All young players deserve the highest praise for their sportsmanship.

This 40-team event was organised by the Turkish Chess Federation from August 29 to September 5, 2012, India had won this event more than once before but Russia fielded a very strong team. Top seed Russia won the title followed by second seed Iran taking the second place. Third seed India finished third. India lost to Russia and Iran and beat the rest of the eight teams.

# Women's FIDE Grand Prix Series held at Ankara, Turkey from 15th to 29th September, 2012



The final leg of 2011-2012 FIDE Grand Prix was won by Koneru Humpy of India at Ankara, capital of Turkey on September 28, 2012. The 12-player all-play-all event had a prize fund of Rs.28,00,000.



# World Youth Chess Championship 2012 held at Maribor, Slovenia from 07th to 19th November, 2012

Excellent chess played by our children helped India to finish No. I along with Russia with identical tally of medals (3 Gold, 2 Silver and 3 Bronze) in the World Youth Chess Championship where 91 countries took part, thus showcasing India as the growing power in children's chess.

Following the Under-10 Gold won by N.Priyanka with a round to spare, Vaishali and M.Mahalakshmi, both of Chennai, became World Under-12 and 14 Champions after an exciting final round at Slovenia. India had its fair share of excitement in the final round. R Vaishali (Girls Under-12) and MMahalakshmi (Girls Under-14) became world champions in their categories as the World Youth Chess Championship came to a close at Maribor in Slovenia on November 18, 2012. We had some misses too.





Overall, India won three titles or gold medals, two silver and three bronze. We won a total of eight medals, the most along with Russia. Russia also won three gold, two silver and three bronze. Having won a gold medal in the Girls Under-10 (N Priyanka, 9.5/11) with a round to spare, Indians looked for more on the final day. Our setback came in the Under-14 section. Arayindh Chithambaram of Madurai who was leading by a full point lost and his tie-break at 9/11 was good only for the silver medal. Girish Koushik of Mysore won a



silver medal in the Under-16 section with a last round victory to reach 8.5/11.1vana Furtado of Goa played the spoil sport when she beat Monnisha of Chennai in the final round. But, M Mahalakshmi, also of Chennai played a great game to win the title in the Girls Under-14 section.

Mahalakshmi's tie-break was better than the Georgian player, both scoring 9/11. Monnisha got the bronze medal on 8/11. Ivana finished fourth on eight points.L.N. Ram Aravind of Trichy finished third in the Under-10 section with 8.5 points with a final round victory. Our best section might have been Girls Under-14 but the Girls Under-12 was not too far behind. R Vaishali won the title and Riya Savant won the bronze medal in the same section. India's three gold, two silver and three bronze medals would be the best after Batumi 2006 and Vietnam 2008. We did not win any title in Greece 2010 and won only one title at Brazil last year. Thus, it is a marked improvement on that front by our players over recent performances.



#### Category tournament for Men & Women held at Delhi and Bhubaneswar.

The All India Chess Federation had introduced a new format of International Round Robin tournament with higher category with a prize fund of Rs. 12 lakhs and for Women with a prize fund of Rs. 8 lakhs, the full prize money funded by the Federation. The first edition of the tournament was conducted at Delhi from 20th to 30th December, 2012. The tournament was won by GM Korobov Anton of Ukraine. The Women tournament was held at Bhubaneswar, Orissa from 17th to 27th March, 2013. The tournament was won by WGM Olga Girya of Russia.



#### International events conducted:

We successfully organized 9 major International events in 2013. Apart from Commonwealth Chess Championship held at Chennai and Asian Schools Chess Championship at Delhi, we organized seven Grandmasters International tournaments namely Parsynath GM International Open Chess Tournament at Delhi, Chennai Open GM International Chess Tournament at Chennai, Odisha Open GM Chess Tournament at Orissa, Mumbai Open GM Chess Tournament at Mumbai, Kolkata Open GM Chess Tournament at Kolkata, Nagpur GM Chess Tournament at Nagpur and Vizag International GM Chess tournament at Vizag, AP.

### Rated Players:

The number of FIDE rated players from India increased from 8195 to 9984 as on March 2013 FIDE Rating List. We have at present 31 Grand Masters, 78 International Masters, 8 Women Grand Masters, 19 Women International Masters, 43 FIDE Masters, 26 Women FIDE Masters, 14 Candidate Masters, 5 Woman Candidate Masters, 95 International Arbiters and 95 FIDE Arbiters. It is against this back drop that we are upgrading our targets and submit the revised LTDP for the period 2013-2017.

#### AICF Chronicle:

The monthly official magazine of the Federation "AICF Chronicle" edited by C.G.S.Narayanan, features reports, final standings and annotated games of various tournaments organized all over the country along with photographs of important events. It also presents fact files of Indian Grandmasters / International Masters / Woman Grandmasters, international news of interest, end games studies, middle game tactics, portraits on masters of the past, articles on chess problems and Tournament Calendar. The members were requested to download the magazine from the Federation's official website www.indianchessfed.org as limited copies are printed for circulation to affiliated units and institutions. The content is enriched by Mr.Manuel Aaron, India's first International Master who annotates the games and by Mr.S.Krishnan.

#### National Championships:

All the National Champions were held and the players were identified to represent the country one year in advance. In other words the players had one year time to prepare themselves for the Asian and World Championship matches. Due to this system we were able to prepare well and the results are there for a everybody to see. We give below the top 15 ranks of our National Championships.







With the support of everybody like the players, state associations, coaches, arbiters managers, organizers, state governments, SAI, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, I am sure that Indian Chess will grow from strength to strength in the years to come. I place on record my thanks to all of them and specially to my President Mr.J.C.D. Prabhakar for guiding me and the Federation in a perfect way so that we were able to fulfill the objects that are enshrined in our constitution.

### NOTES ON ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31.03.2013

#### 1. Significant Accounting Policies

- 1.1. The Financial statements of the Association are prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India. The Accounting Policies adopted in preparation of financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year except for change in accounting policy for Depreciation which is provided for the first time during the year.
- 1.2. Depreciation has been provided on WDV method at 10% on all the assets.
- 1.3. Revenue is recognized based on nature of activity when revenue can be reasonably measured and there exists reasonable certainty of its recovery. Interest income on Fixed deposits is accounted as per statements furnished by the Banks. Other revenue is accounted net of related expenses.
- 1.4. Fixed Assets are carried at cost less depreciation. The cost of fixed asset comprises of its purchase price net of trade discounts and rebates.
- 1.5. Foreign exchange transactions are recognized at the rates prevalent on the date of transaction. Loss/profit is recognized at the time of actual realization. Monetary items of assets and liabilities at the end of the year are stated at the rates prevalent on the closing date.
- 1.6. Government grants towards conduct of national and international tournaments and exposure of Indian players in foreign countries are recognized as income on realization.
- 1.7. Impairment of assets is recognized based on yearly review.
- 1.8. Contingent liabilities are not recognized and disclosed.
- Opening balances for the year 2004-05 are not available as the relevant books and other records are not received from the erstwhile office bearers and hence statement of affairs is prepared.
- Depreciation is provided for the first time during the year # 10% on the WDV of assets.
   Depreciation relating earlier years are also provided.
- Income & Expenditure account & the Statement of affairs prepared as on 31/03/13
  represent transactions that have taken place during the year 2012-2013. Income &
  Expenditure do not include air tickets provided by the Government directly to the
  players.
- The Federation has preferred suit before the Madras High Court for recovery of a sum of about Rs.1, 11, 12,831/- from Mr. P. T. Ummer Koya and others towards the moneys belonging to the Federation.



- 6. A) The Income Tax department had completed assessment for the assessment year 2009-10. The income earned by the Association from Doordharshan and certain other receipts were considered as receipts in the nature of commercial nature. A demand of Rs 28:25,760/- after adjusting the tax deducted at source of Rs.12.360/- is raised against the Association. The demand includes interest element of Rs.7,01,118/-.The Association has preferred an appeal before the Appellate tribunal Chennai since the appeal filed before the Commissioner of Income Tax Appeals was dismissed. However the taxes as demanded by the Income tax department was paid.
  - B) The Income tax department has raised a further demand of Rs.3,95,598/- in respect of the assessment year 2009-10 being the interest u/s 220(2) of the income tox act for delayed remittance of tax amount of Rs.28,25,760/-. The association had preferred a waiver petition before the Director of Income tax exemption in addition to the further appeal before the Income tax Appellate Tribunal, Chennai. Pending disposal of the petition and Appeal by the Appellate tribunal no provision in the accounts for the said amount is made.
  - c) The Income tax department had completed assessment for the assessment year 2010-11. The Income earned by the association from doordharashan and certain other receipts were considered as receipts are treated as commercial nature. As a result the entire surplus earned by the society is brought to tax and a demand of Rs.17,42,290/-after adjusting the tax deducted at source of Rs.1,07,120/-is raised against the association. The association has preferred an appeal before the commissioner of income tax appeals, Chennai. Pending disposal of the appeal no provision is made in the financial statements for the above demand.


