Arbiters have to be thorough with Laws of Chess, Rating, FIDE and FICF Regulations and other related rules.3. Arbiters shall obtain their permission from All India Chess Federation (through their state associations) to serve tournaments in other countries.5. An arbiter who wants to serve in tournaments held in states other than his own, has to get their permission from his state association (through the District Association) to do so.6. Only qualified and skilled chess players can arbiters in tournaments. For state championships and other level tournaments, at least, South National Arbiters One should be appointed as Chief arbiter. At State level tournament, the chief arbiter should be atleast state level arbiter. For other tournaments, the chief arbiter should be at least a FIDE arbiter.7. ANNUAL REPORT 2014 - 2015

Dear Friends,

It is with great pleasure I present the Annual report of our activities for the year 2014 - 2015 to the august body after a fresh set of office bearers were elected at the AGM held in June 2014 at Chennai. We have a new President in Mr.P.L.Venkatarama Raja the Vice Chairman and M.D. of Ramco group of companies who were the first to sponsor 5 times world champion GM Viswanathan Anand for nearly a decade after 1991. It was his vision that India should win a medal in the Olympiad and he instigated a meeting of the newly elected office bearers of AICF in July 2014 to formulate ideas to achieve the dream which every living Indian wanted. I am therefore fortunate to be the Hon. Secretary of the Federation when India created chess history by winning the first ever medal in a chess Olympiad held at Tromso, Norway during August 2014. I am referring to the bronze medal winning performances of our team led by Commander K.Sankaran and the other members of the team namely GM K.Adhikari, GM S.P.Sethuraman, GM. M.K.Lalith Babu and GM Parimarjan Negi with GM K.B.Ramesh as the coach.

To enjoy this unique achievement, the Federation got up a function to felicitate these medal winners and presented them with a cheque of Rs.2 lakhs each and Rs.1.5 lakhs to the coach, GM K.Sankaran and YGR Padmani Rao were also presented a cash awards for their medal winning performances in playing 3' and 4' board at the Olympiad respectively.

Further, the Central Council of the All India Chess Federation decided to honour the above medal winning Olympiad team members by organising an India - China women chess match with the prize fund of Rs.10 lakhs sponsored by the AICF by letting second the Indian players shared Rs.4 lakhs prize fund among themselves. The match which was held at Hyderabad was organised by the Telangana Chess Association Ad-hoc committee and special thanks to MRS.S.Prasad who was instrumental in hosting the match by getting the sponsors.

Year after year it is seen that the All India Chess Federation is growing in stature due to sustained work put in by all the stake holders like the State Associations, organisers of various tournaments, the coaches, the academies, the arbiters, the players supported by many State Governments and especially the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India / Sports Authority of India. Added to these is a bunch of dedicated set of office bearers of the Federation who lift no stone unturned to run the Federation as per its objectives. The office bearers have been fortunate enough to have have working Secretarial staff and the guidance of its President Mr.P.R. Venkatarama Raja.

All these things have resulted in some spectacular performances by our players who continued the good legacy that has been established, especially from 2005, and have made an impact by their spectacular performances both at the Asian and World forums. The Federation was very active and a record 249 tournaments were rated by the FIDE of which 25 were International open tournaments. All the National Championships were held as planned and the players were selected to represent India on the basis of the performances in these championships. As a result of all these, at the end of this financial year we have 36 Grand Masters, 80 International Masters, 7 Women Grand Masters, 23 Women International Masters, 46 FIDE Masters, 31 Women FIDE Masters, Candidate Masters, Women Candidate Masters, 100 International Arbiters and 105 FIDE Arbiters. We are now ranked 8 in the Men FIDE ranking list and 5 in the women. The number of FIDE registered players has increased to 46726 from 38075 and the number of players currently rated is 17244 as on 31.03.2015. The number of players registered with AICF is 17297. This is a quantum jump over the year.

Thanks to the organisation of so many tournaments, the chess players benefited immensely by way of prize money to the tune of Rs.4,67,43,411.00. Of these, Rs.3,69,51,411.00 were given as prize money in all the rating tournaments put together, Rs.42,62,000.00 was given as prize money in all the National Championships and Rs.54,50,000.00 was given as prize money in all the Grandmaster tournaments.

As usual the Federation organised two official FIDE championships. The World Junior Chess Championship was organised at Feroz by the Maharashtra Chess Association under the aegis of Maharashtra Chess Association from 05th to 19th October, 2014. The Asian Youth U14, 16, 18 Chess Championship was organised at Delhi by the Delhi Chess Association from 06th to 14th November, 2014. Both these tournaments were a resounding success. Due to bringing such tournaments to India, the AICF has helped hundreds of our players to participate in otherwise they have to travel abroad spending huge money to participate in such tournaments.

The Federation had not only concentrated on developing the game and the players but had also took care to arm itself with more technically qualified persons by organising a Arbiters Seminar at Delhi from 11th to 13th November, 2014 and a Trainer's Seminar also at Delhi from 27th to 29th June, 2014. Apart from this India played host to the Arden's Refresher course conducted by the FIDE. Needless to say, these Seminars has helped us to have more technically qualified people.

I am also happy to share with you that Indian presence in FIDE has also increased manifold. FIDE officials have started respecting India and the Federation, especially after our successful conduct of the FIDE World Championship Match between Grandmaster V Anand and Grandmaster Magnus Carlsen in 2013. The western chess world has started looking up at India. As a result many of our members have found a place in various FIDE committees. Mr D V Anand our former Secretary of the All India Chess Federation has been re-elected as the Vice President of FIDE with a record 103 votes (highest among

13 contestants.) at the FIDE Congress held at Norway in August 2014: Mr. Bharat Bhojra was elected as the President of Commonwealth Chess and Deputy President of the Asian Chess Federation. He was also nominated as the Chairman of the Rules and Technical committee of the FIDE. Mr. K. M. Dongre has been nominated as the Chairman in the Chess in Schools committee. Mr. R. Anantharam has been nominated as the Counsellor in the Arbitrator's commission and member of the Qualification Commission & Systems of Pairing and Programs. Mr. V. Hanumanth has been nominated as a member of the qualification commission. Mr. Sankar Saha has been nominated as a member of the FIDE Trainers' commission.

With 33 affiliated units and 12 Institutional members with thousands of subsidiary units functioning under these entities the game of chess has thus spread all over the country which helps the federation in furthering its cause. The activities from all over India gained momentum as 249 tournaments were rated by the FIDE out of which 198 tournaments were FIDE rated tournaments. Delhi, Nadi, State Chess Association, Delhi Chess Association, Venus Chess Academy, All Orissa Chess Association, and Baroda Chess Academy were instrumental in organized International Grandmaster Tournaments thus making it possible for our players to get FIDE title norms. We should also appreciate the following State Associations for facilitating rating tournaments - Maharashtra (41), Tamil Nadu (39), Karnataka (37), Kerala (37), Delhi (36), Orissa (34), Telangana (18), West Bengal (9), Gujarat (7), Goa (6), Andhra Pradesh (4), Assam (4), Jharkhand (3), Bihar (2), Punjab (2), Uttar Pradesh (2), Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir, Mizoram, Madhya Pradesh, Pondicherry each (1) making it a total of 198.

The vision of AICF is to make India the strongest chess playing country of the world. It is not to become a reality, India is now ranked 101 in the number of FIDE registered players, 48725 as per FIDE. We have surpassed giants like Russia 42766, France 39769, Spain 34516, Germany 29503. Thanks to the continued support of the Government, we were able to provide our players with all possible foreign exposure and also give them intensive coaching under eminent and renowned chess masters.

At the administrative level I am happy to share with you that the Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Madras by its Order dated 07/03/2015 had INTERIM ORDER MADE ABSOLUTE IN THE MATTER OF AICF vs CHESS ASSOCIATION OF INDIA as given below:

"In the matter, the interim injunction already granted by this Court on 28/12/2012 in O.A.No.1078 of 2012 is made absolute and the application is ordered accordingly. Consequently, the application in A.No.1955 of 2013 seeking to revoke the leave granted by this Court in A.No.5615 of 2012 with its order dated 27/12/2012 is dismissed since this Court has come to the conclusion that this Court has got jurisdiction to decide the issue involved in the suit."

Earlier in December 2012, the Court had passed the following Interim Order:

"The Chess Association of India, Rep. By its Secretary General, Surendra K. Jagan, the 1st respondent herein, be and are hereby restrained by an order of

interim injunction from using it, its name or domain name of website/URL, etc. and wants "India" or "Indian" and from conducting chess tournaments in the name and style of "National Championships/Tournaments".

Financially, the AICF has utilised its funds wisely and we look comfortable. It is our desire to have a very healthy bank balance so that we can increase our chess development programs without any financial constraints.

We list below our notable achievements during the year that has gone by:

World Rapid and Blitz Championships 2014 held at Dubai, UAE from 15th to 21st June, 2014

Arvind Bhatt Carlsen: INDIA'S BRONZE MEDAL

World chess champion Magnus Carlsen of Norway won the World Rapid Chess Championship (that concluded at Dubai on June 15, 2014). Carlsen suffered one defeat against Viswanathan Anand in round twelve and then did well to finish half a point ahead of the 113-player field.



Players from 82 countries took part. It included 57 Grand Masters, six IMs, 19 FMs, and one Candidate Master. India fielded seven. The prize fund in the World Rapid was 400,000 dollars with Carlsen getting USD 40,000.

Anand played all 15 GMs in three days and finished undefeated. He started as the ninth seed and took bronze medal.


41st World Chess Olympiad 2014 held at Tromsø, Norway from 1st to 15th August, 2014

INDIA'S HISTORICAL TRIUMPH Team India wins Bronze at Tromsø

India surprised one and all by winning the bronze medal. India had been playing chess Olympiad since Moscow 1956. This is our best ever showing so far. In 2010, when China dropped out of the World Team Championships, India replaced them and finished third.

India came into this Olympiad without Anand and Harikrishna. The best ever placing recorded was sixth in Cavite 2004. It looked like an achievement even if they finished ahead of their 1st seed.

India managed not to lose matches in the last seven rounds and it mattered in Swiss format competitions. Three Indians, Sethuraman, Sasikiran and Adhiban also remained undefeated. India's 3.5-0.5 victory margin against Uzbekistan in the final round pushed us ahead of the USA for the second to fifth places for the first time. Our 10-break gave us bronze medal. Together with China, an Asian majority is the podium and things to ponder for world chess in the coming years.



India won seven matches, lost one and drew three for this excellent showing. Coach Grand Master R.D. Rajmestri used the available resources very well. Double medal winner for India was Krishnan Sasikiran. Sasikiran won the silver medal for his 7.5/10 in the third board, apart from the team bronze medal.

Indian women finished tenth on 15 match points after scoring six wins, three draws and two defeats. It is a slip from our all-time best of fourth place in 2012.

World Youth Championships 2014 held at Durban, South Africa from 18th to 30th September 2014

India tops medal tally yet again and adjudged the best nation

Though our medal tally was only six compared to eight last year, this year also India bagged the Gharial Trophy for the best performing country for the third time in succession. Jitil Sarin of Kollayam, Kerala and Divya Deshmukh of Nagercoil, Maharashtra hailed India with more medals than other nations in the World Youth Chess Championships that concluded at Durban in South Africa on September 29, 2014. India won six medals, comprising of two gold, two silver and two bronze. Behind India on three medals was Russia and the rest had just two medals or less.

Overall, Asia dominated the show winning 18 out of 26 medals. India and China's dominance have been more or less continuing over the years - India (31) had the second highest number of entrants, after hosts South Africa (167). A total of 959 players from 87 nations took part in this event that ran from Sep 20-29, 2014.

India organises the World Junior U20 Championships 2014 at Pune, from 5th to 20th October, 2014.

India staged the World Junior Chess Championships for the first time (earlier versions were held at Calcutta, Kochi, Goa and Chennai) at Hyatt, a luxurious five star hotel in Pune. The championships gained momentum, once when former world champion Vishwanathan Anand was declared the friend and ambassador of the event. The tournament was played from 5th October to 19th October and conducted in the Swiss League format, comprising 13 rounds, with one round scheduled weekly.

The open section attracted 137 players and the girls' championship had 71 entries, with players hailing from fifty countries from all continents. Probably, the strongest ever event in the junior category, the open championship was spearheaded by 18 IMs, 21 IMs and 16 IMs, including five players above 2600 rating. The Under-20 girls' event had 1 IM, 4 WGMs, 13 WIMs and 2 FIMs. Fierce fight was evinced until the end, as the winner would qualify for the World Cup. Vladimir Fedoseev of Russia, with a rating of 2665 and the defending champion Aleksandra Goryachkina also from Russia were the top seeds in the open and girls categories respectively.

The WJCC-2014 was jointly organized by the MCA and Pune District Chess Circle.

The organizing committee of WJCC-2014 comprised prominent chess players and key personalities of various Chess Associations namely Satish Jain, Raymond Dongre, Zone President of World Chess Federation (FIDE) and Treasurer, AICF and, Challenge of PCA, SRILAKSHMAYILL, Vice President of the PDCC, Niranjan Godbole, Secretary of PDCC, Chess Grand Master ABHIJIT KUMAR, Prakash Kunte and Moheshwari Bhagwat Dongre was the Championship Director of the mega event. And India is ready to host the championships again in 2016, as per the FIDE calendar.



Magnus Carlsen of Norway retained his world chess title beating challenger Vishal Anand in the eleventh match game to win the 12-match series with 6½ points to 4½.

Overall in the match, Carlsen won games two, six and seven. Anand won game three and other games were draws. If Anand had won game six, history could have been different.



World Youth U-16 Chess Olympiad 2014 held at Győr, Hungary from 12th to 21st December 2014

India Retains World Youth Olympiad Title

India retained the World Youth Chess Olympiad title by remaining ahead of Iran and Russia at the end of the tenth round at Győr in Hungary on December 21, 2014. Significantly, India is winning this title for the fourth time.

A total of 37 nations took part in this ten round Swiss format event on four boards.

The coach R.B. Ramesh received Rs 2.50 lacs and Padma Raju, the gold medal winner on the Women's Olympiad board five received Rs150,000. The AICF President P.R. Venketrana Raja congratulated the players and coach R.B. Ramesh for this pioneering achievement.



A. Narasimha Reddy, Vice President, AICF also felicitated the bronze medal winning team and singled out Lality Babu from Andhra. V. Raghavarao, AICF Honorary Secretary proffered vote of thanks. Also on the dais were R.M. Dongre, AICF Treasurer, first International Master Manoj Arora, Warrin's team coach at the Olympiad and AICF Vice President S.C. Sarin. Of the players, Neel, Saksham and Lality Babu were present. Saksham and Adithan were represented by their family members.

Replying to the felicitations, R.B. Ramesh said the team members and his childhood friend Saksham adjusted very well and the Asian Nations Cup event served impetus to warm up to this event well. He thanked the AICF for taking the players to Indian restaurants in Norway.

India - China Summit held at Hyderabad from 01st to 10th March 2015

The second half did not go India's way. After the sides won two rounds each to be level at 8-8 at the half way stage, the second half went decisively in favour of the visitors. China won 4.5-1.5, 3-1, 2-2 and 2.5-1.5 to wrap up the series with a healthy four point margin. The Chinese pulled up their socks in the second half to win the 4-player Schwesinger system double round event with a 18-14 margin at Hyderabad on March 10, 2015. The Telangana Chess Association organised this event on behalf of the sponsors, the All India Chess Federation.



Considering the strength of the teams, a similar score could have been anticipated. However, being hosts, India should have done better! Sakshiraj and Adhikari were off-form! Sethuraman and Lalith Babu performed well.

Sethuraman scored 5/8 and Lalith Babu got 4.5/8 to pump up points into their April 2015 numbers. Sakshiraj made 2 and Adhikari 2.5 and the Indian scoring suffered on account of it. China won out the medals they got would not have pleased their rating numbers. Ding Liren made 5/8, Wei Yi and Wang Chen scored 4 1/8 each. Zhou Jiangchao 4

China won the Komarpally Pratap Reddy Trophy and INR 600,000 while India received INR 400,000. The Governor of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana States, E.S. Narasimhan was the Chief Guest in the closing ceremony. The aim of this event was to give training for the Indian team before playing in the World Team Championship at Armenia. Facing Olympic Champions China would be the best practice and the All India Chess Federation provided that. The event took place at the Marriott Hotel in Hyderabad.

Asian Youth U6, U8, U10, U12 Championship 2014 held at Tashkent, Uzbekistan from 20th to 29th June, 2014

India tops medal tally

India, hosts Uzbekistan and Mongolia took the top three places for the best overall showing at the Asian Youth Chess Championships that concluded at Tashkent on June 29, 2014. India won seven gold, four silver and seven bronze medals in the overall sections of rapid, classical and blitz.



In the classical event, despite the last round jitters, India won one gold, two silver and three bronze in classical chess. Samikant Wadhwa won the gold medal for India in the under-8 girls section. Ravi Aravind (under-12 Open) and Khushagra Motian (under-10 Open) won silver medals. Praggnanandhaa (under-10 Open), Aditya Mittal (under-8 Open) and Anant Rampal (under-8 Open) won bronze medals.

**Asian Youth U14, U16, U18 Championship 2014, New Delhi, India
from 6th to 14th November 2014**

India lifts overall Trophy

34 medals out of 54 was the latest honour for India at the Asian Youth Chess Championship for Open and Girls (under 14,16 and 18) at New Delhi. This Continental championship organised by FIDE Chess Association at Hotel Park Plaza, New Delhi from November 7 to 13, 2014 had attracted a total number of 136 players drawn from 15 national federations. India fielded maximum number of 50 contingents by virtue of winning maximum medals in the last edition followed by United Arab Emirates (23) and Iran (13).



The championship was organised under three formats namely Rapid, Standard and Blitz. On day one, on 7th November Rapid tournament was held with a total number of 7 rounds. The time duration was 15 minutes with 10 seconds to increment. It was a cake walk for India in the girls section when they grabbed all the three Golds in under 14 (WFM R. Varunika), under 16 (WFM M. Mahalaxmi) and under 18 (WFM Sija Senthani). However in the Open category, India could win Gold only in the under 18 (Mohammed N. Ballishah Shalith), leaving Gold in under 14 to Heli Giovanni (Philippines) and in under 16 to IM Tahereh M. Ahini Iran. Another good news for the host India was that it made a clean sweep in the under 16-girls and under 15 open categories by winning Gold, Silver and Bronze.

International events conducted:

We successfully organized 7 major International events in 2014. Apart from World Junior Chess Championship held at Pune and Asian youth U - 14, 16 and 18 Boys & Girls Chess Championship held at Delhi, we organized 5 Grandmasters International tournaments namely 1st International Open Grandmaster Chess Tournament 2014 at Kolkata, 06th KIT International GM Open - 2014 - Category 'A' above 2000 at Bhuvaneshwar, 7th Meyer's Cup International Open Chess Tournament 'A' at Mumbai, 13th Delhi International Open 2015 at New Delhi and Chennai Open 2014 Above 1800 Category 'A' at Chennai.

By organizing these international tournaments players were able to rub shoulders with the talents from other countries. Without spending much money, if they had to do abroad, they were able to enjoy International exposure. These tournaments have helped our players to garner FIDE titles norms like GM, WGM, IM, WIM norms etc.

Rated Players:

The number of FIDE rated players from India increased from 12853 to 17344 as on 31st March 2015 FIDE Rating List. We have at present 36 Grand Masters, 82 International Masters, 14 Woman Grand Masters, 22 Women International

Masters, 63 FIDE Masters, 31 Women FIDE Masters, 24 Candidate Masters, 13 Woman Candidate Masters, 101 International Arbiters and 123 FIDE Arbiters, 02 FIDE Senior Trainers, 21 FIDE Trainers, 34 FIDE Instructor, 22 National Instructor and 89 Developmental Instructor. It is against this backdrop that we are upgrading our targets and submit the revised UDF for the period 2015-2019.

In the number of FIDE registered players also, we are happy to share with you, that India has now the largest number 45726 in the file of World Chess Federation (FIDE) surpassing the super powers like Russia 42756, France 39769, Spain 34616, Germany 29501.

AICF Chronicle:

The monthly chess magazine of the Federation "AICF Chronicle" edited by C.E.S. Narayanan, features reports, final standings and annotated games of various tournaments organised all over the country along with photographs of important events. It also presents fact files of Indian Grandmasters / International Masters / Woman Grandmasters, International news of interest, and games studies, middle game tactics, portraits on masters of the past, articles on chess problems and Tournament Calendar. Mention should be made of the contributions by India's first International Master Arjun Awarded Mahabali Anand and Mrs.S.Krishnan for contributing immensely to make the AICF chronicle interesting for the chess enthusiast. The members were requested to download the magazine from the federation's official website www.aicf.in as limited copies are printed for circulation to affiliated units and institutions.

National Championships:

All the National Championships were held and the players were identified to represent the country one year in advance. In other words, the players had one year time to prepare themselves for the Asian and World Championship matches. Due to this system we were able to prepare well and the results are there for everybody to see. We give below the top 15 ranks of our National Championships.




